
The MEIKLE Family

The Meikle family moved from Peachester to Maleny around 1936. **Norm** and his wife **Bessie**, who were descendants of the early pioneers of Peachester, settled into their first home in Coral Street. Norm, a blacksmith, set up his own business next to the family home. They subsequently had five children, **Mona**, **Hazel**, **Ron**, **Marion** and **Heather**. In 1951, the old home was demolished and a new home was built and stands on the same site today. The family lived in the garage whilst the house was being built. The new home was built by **Nev Anning** and **Jack Francis** from Peachester. Many years later, the old blacksmith's shop was demolished and Norm went to work with the Railways. In the early 60's Bessie was employed as a cook at the Maleny Hospital.

The children all attended the local school, firstly at the Cedar Street site and later at the new site in Bunya Street. Mona was a student in the first class of the Maleny Secondary Department in 1954. She was later employed in the office at the Maleny Butter Factory until her marriage to local lad **Raymond Daley**. Hazel began her teaching career at the Maleny State School in 1960 until her marriage to **Greg Woods** from Kenilworth in 1965. Ron, a sheet metal worker, travelled to New Zealand where he married **Carol Barton**. Marion, a teacher, met her husband **Chris Hunt** whilst teaching in the N.T. Heather, a nurse met her husband **Ian Dauth**, whilst nursing in Beaudesert. Heather and Mona still live in Maleny.
