MRS. LUCILLE LOVEGROVE.

The death occurred recently at Rockhampton general hospital of Mrs. Lucille Lovegrove, wife of Mr. C. A. Lovegrove, of Maleny (Q.) both Mr. and Mrs. Lovegrove were well-known in the Richmond River district. Mrs. Lovegrove was born in England, and was a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Charles Jarvis Bree of Leicester City. She was the youngest of a family of two sons and six daughters. A few years after leaving college, Miss Bree went to Egypt and resided in Cairo for some time, and then returned to England-passing through the Straits of Messina whilst the remains of the city were still smoking after the great earthquake had destroyed it.

In 1910, after her parents had both died, she went to New Zealand and lived with her mother's sister for some time. In 1914 she crossed over from New Zealand to Australia, where she spent a couple of years in New South Wales and Queensland. From 1916 to 1918 she lived in New Guinea, and then returned to Australia and was married to Mr. C. A. Lovegrove in Sydney in 1919.

After their marriage Mr. and Mrs. Lovegrove went to America, where Mr. Lovegrove; remained in the service of the Bethlehem Corporation, whilst Mrs. Lovegrove went to England on a lengthy visit to her people. Returning to America from England in 1920, she lived with her husband in San Francisco and Oakland, until they returned to Australia in 1922. Shortly afterwards, Mr. Lovegrove purchased land near Maleny, and there she resided until recently.
